
It was sea coast tribe descendants of Nihon Sojin, original Japanese in the era of 40,000 BP.

Small people of Pre-Ainu, sea tribe, went out from Hokkaido to north.

Morse, American invited prof. found Oumori shell mound in 1877 and stated about people there in the site as **Pre-Ainu** ones.

Prof. Tsuboi wrote in 1887 that small people of sea tribe once existed **before Ainu** and had went northward **from Hokkaido to Tishima** archipelago. They seemed to be **similar to Eskimos, Aleuts**.








Coldness in Beringia



Sea water of Bering might be warmer because cold water of North Pole wasn't flown in Bering sea in that era. So, Beringia Navarin might be warmer and so little of difference from Hokkaido.

Crossing the straits in Tishima Archipelago



Homo sapience to Japanese Archipelago, Nihon Sojin, had crossed sea strait by small boat to Kyusyu and later on had ability of sea crossing at least 20km in Izu area.

 The widest strait in Tishima Archipelago was 77 km, but they could see mountain in the other side, next island. And it was calm sea.

In every strait, they luckily could see next island from a mountain hill.

- 3. The first or new comers to Tishima Archipelago found plenty of sea food by getting easily.
- 4. The coldest temperature was similar to Hokkaido, so they'd already been got accustomed to cold weather life there.








Longhouse and Totem pole


Haida people and oars in the event






Result of DNA analysis on 3 old Amazon tribes by Harvard Medical School is now understandable.
